## Student Leadership Conference (SLC)

November the 12<sup>th</sup> to 18<sup>th</sup> saw SLC2007. Over one hundred students and staff gathered together from across New Zealand to study Nehemiah. We also split into three different streams: stream one for new students, stream two for continuing students and stream three for students who were graduating. We looked in our streams at a range of different subjects from how to study the bible, to how to engage with missional opportunities that a campus offers, to developing a theology of work.

The conference was a really encouraging time for all involved. It was great to see students reaching for their bibles when thinking things through. All involved came away with a deeper understanding of the book of Nehemiah. I was particularly struck by how Nehemiah responds to challenges by the way he acts, but also trusting in God. This is particularly evident in chapter four, where each person works with their sword strapped to their side, but Nehemiah is clear that they don't trust in their own strength but in God. For us we shouldn't be paralysed by whether what we are planning is God's will or not, but neither should we act as if it all hinges upon us. Ultimately this is God's world and what he wills will happen.

**Personal News**

There have been some changes in the TSCF office and as a result my job has changed a little. Basically I am responsible for keeping on top of TSCF's accounts. TSCF has not had an accountant on staff for five years and across that time small errors have crept in that we are working hard on rectifying. I am not trained in accountancy so I have had a lot to learn very quickly and I am very grateful for those who have spent time helping me begin to get my head round things. The change has given me the opportunity to spend some time working on some of our internal processes and simplifying them, which is helping in other areas.

It is not clear at present for how long I will be covering the finance role but I will be continuing my campus work next year at least two days a week.

I am very thankful for your ongoing prayer and financial support of my work. As I mentioned in my last prayer letter I now only have about 65% of my yearly support target raised. The recent visit to the UK was great (back to that in a second) but I did not gain any new supporters as hoped and planned. I have gained some new NZ supporters which is an answer to prayer. I still need to raise an additional £6500/\$17000 per year. I would really value your prayers in this area over the coming months as if I cannot find some new supporters I will have to take a decrease in salary in February. It is something that you think you could help with or If you know of people who may be interested in supporting me please do let me know.

Anna (if you don't know who Anna is, [go here](#)) and I had a great time running around the UK meeting each other's friends and family whilst I caught up with some of my supporters. We also got to celebrate Christmas with my family, which was really special for me (see [www.wellington-boots.blogspot.com](http://www.wellington-boots.blogspot.com)) for more details). Anna is, as we speak, making her farewells and preparing to leave on the 3<sup>rd</sup> January. But it would be great if you could remember her and her family in your prayers too.
